ARTICLE UPDATES – "POWER OF IDEAS" Digital Payment in India Challenges and Opportunities

When the Indian government demonetized high-value banknotes on the night of 8 November, taking out 86% of the currency in circulation by value, it was supposed to be a war on unaccounted-for and untaxed wealth, counterfeit notes and terror financing. Somewhere along the way, as serpentine queues formed outside bank branches and automated teller machines (ATMs) for days and weeks together, the slogan changed.

It became all about promoting a cashless or at least a less-cash culture in an economy where almost 90% of transactions are paid for in cash. The talk turned to technologies such as mobile wallets, cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin, mobile peer-to-peer payments, block chain technology, payment banks and architectures such as the unified payment When the Indian government invalidated high-value banknotes on the night of 8 November, taking out 86% of the currency in circulation by value, it was supposed to be a war on unaccounted-for and untaxed wealth, counterfeit notes and terror financing.

Indeed, the growing popularity and rapid adoption of digital payment systems, in the face of a shortage of cash and stringent limits on bank withdrawals, may be a silver lining to the demonetization of Rs500 and Rs. 1,000 notes—an exercise that some critics have slammed as ill-conceived and hastily implemented.

To be sure, India has a long way go before it joins the ranks of countries such as Sweden, Finland, Canada, the Netherlands, Belgium, Singapore, France and the UK where more than 85% of the consumer payment transactions are done digitally.

Barriers to a cashless world include the fact that "some merchants still don't want the infrastructure costs and fees associated with electronic payments; some customers still find cash more convenient; access is an issue for individuals without bank accounts; and fraudsters continue to find opportunities in electronic transactions.

Security is another big concern. Those who have been transacting online are fairly well-versed with the threats one can face while paying online, it's the first-time users or new adaptors that need to be educated on the risks they are exposed to.

There are 5 key challenges to government's policy on going cashless in India:

1. Tech literacy - even reasonably educated often get stumped with many of the technologies.

2. Tech coverage - India's cellular internet coverage is not that good and so is the smartphone penetration.

3. Financial inclusion - Many don't have easy access to banks, ATMs, Point of Sale terminals etc.

4. Transaction fees - the existing players like Visa and Master card charge exorbitant fees especially for smaller transactions.

5. Enforcing tax rules - In India, most shopkeepers escape from paying taxes as the rules are complicated and taxes are high. Getting them to comply is going to be hard.

In order to be successful in cash less India drive, we must work to find out solutions to these issues.

Research Status of Personalized Medicine in Pharmaceutical Field

Personalized medicine is very growing and advance field of healthcare that is informed by genetics, genomics and environmental information. These factors are different for every person, the nature of diseases: including their onset, their course, and how they might respond to drugs as individual as the people who have them. This kind of medicine is making the treatment as individualized as the disease. Most of the studies suggest, these drugs involve Identifying genomic, and clinical information that allows precise predictions to be made about a person's susceptibility of developing disease, and its response to treatment.

Furthermore, personalized medicine to be used merely by healthcare providers and their patients, these findings must be translated into precise diagnostic tests and targeted therapies. It has begun to happen in specified areas, such as testing patients genetically to determine their adverse reaction.

Most of the scientists and physicians are advancing the field of personalized medicine at a fast pace. This is not yet fixed part of the clinical practice, but a number of top-tier medical institutions have personalized medicine programs, and they are actively conducting research and clinical studies in genomic medicine. This kind of medicine has taken major position in the pharmaceutical field because these kinds of medicine address any disease at genomics level.

The idea of personalised medicine can be implemented to new and transformative approaches to health care. Personalised health care is purely based on the dynamics of systems biology and uses predictive tools to analyse health risks and to design personalised health plans to help patient's moderate risks, prevent disease and to treat it with precision when it occurs. Personalised health care are taking position of acceptance with the Veterans Administration committing to personalised, proactive patient driven care for all veterans (who has had long experience in a health care field).

Moreover, Mostly companies that test the DNA of paying consumer such as deCode Genetics, 23and Me, and Navigenics, are being launched around the all over world. Meanwhile, some states now regulate direct-to-consumer genetic tests, regulation is not yet standardized. Mostly Experts suggest that consumers seek interpretation of test results from a professional who specialized or perfect in this type of testing.

Few people may not wish to know their genetic risk for some conditions, such as their chances for developing and untreatable condition, Cancer disease others may find such information has personal utility. For instance, they may use the knowledge they gain more to plan for the future. Our DNA can provide other many insights, as well, such as who our ancestors were. As personalised medicine is

practiced widely, a number of challenges arise. The recent approaches to intellectual property rights, reimbursement policies and patient confidentiality as well as regulatory oversight will have to be redefined and organized to accommodate the changes personalised medicine will bring to healthcare.
